### **SAFETY AND HEALTH VIDEO, DVD, OR CD LENDING LIBRARY AGREEMENT**

**The Safety Consultation and Training Section (SCATS) of the Division of Industrial Relations provides a safety and health video, DVD, and CD lending library service free of charge to all Nevada employers. Nevada employers are encouraged to use this service to supplement employee safety and health awareness training.**

The videos, DVDs, or CDs in the Safety and Health Lending Library are purchased from private production and service companies. While these companies strive to meet all safety and health regulatory requirements, there may be some inaccuracies. Please remember it is your responsibility as an employer to ensure that your employees' training is current and meets the applicable federal, state, and local regulations.

The videos, DVDs, and CDs in the library are available on a loan out basis and are to be used only by employers to supplement their employee training programs. They are not to be used by any company charging a fee. Please be advised that the private companies SCATS purchases the material from do not allow unauthorized copies of the videos, DVDs, or CDs to be made.

#### CHECKOUT PROCEDURES:

- < Videos, DVDs, or CDs may not be reserved in advance, therefore, it is a good idea to have more than one video, DVD, or CD in mind when checking out material at one of the three Safety Consultation and Training Section Offices. You may wish to call ahead on the availability of a particular title prior to coming to the office.
- < A maximum of three videos, DVDs, or CDs may be borrowed. Please be advised that previously loaned videos must be returned before additional videos, DVDs or CDs can be borrowed.
- < Videos, DVDs, and CDs must be returned within five (5) working days from the date of checkout. By returning them promptly, other employers may have the opportunity to use them.
